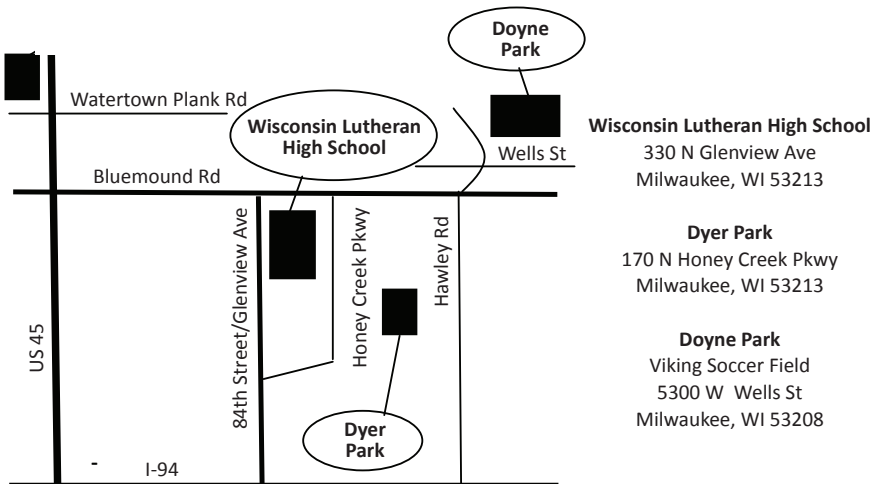

# Girls Basketball Camp

Girls entering grades 5-8

**June 4-7, 2012**

Grades 5-6: 9:00am - 12:00pm

**Purpose and Facilities** WLHS is proud to offer its 34th annual girls summer basketball camp! The goal of our summer camp is to improve the basketball skills of each camper. We accomplish this through instruction, drills, and contests each day. Players in each session will be taught the individual and team concepts necessary to become better players. Each session of our camp varies in its level of instruction. Emphasis is placed on individual offensive skills with special attention given to shooting form, dribbling and passing skills. The afternoon session for older girls will concentrate on more advanced skills involving moving without the ball, rebounding and defensive skills. All girls should report to the main gym at WLHS each day.

**Cost** The camp fee is \$50. This includes instruction, awards, and a camp t-shirt.

**Staff** Head WLHS girls varsity coach Gil Tatge is the camp director. He will be assisted by current WLHS girls basketball staff and athletes.

**Purpose and Facilities** Tennis is one of the few truly life long sports. WLHS is proud to offer a summer camp that will give young athletes the chance to learn the game! This camp is designed to teach the beginner along with the intermediate athlete who wants to improve their tennis game. Campers will learn and review the fundamentals of tennis—the forehand, backhand, serve, volley, and overhead. Each day of camp will be devoted to these basics of tennis, along with time to play the game of tennis. The camp will take place at Dyer Park, located one block east of WLHS on the Honey Creek Parkway. Students should report there each day.

**Cost** The camp fee is \$50. This includes instruction and a camp t-shirt. **Due to limited court space, camp enrollment is limited.**

**Purpose and Facilities** Wrestling instruction at WLHS is geared to the age and skill level of the students. Beginning wrestlers are presented with the foundational skills required of WLHS Viking wrestlers. New skills and techniques are introduced each day of the camp. Emphasis is placed on step-by-step mastery of each move and understanding the principles that are involved which will make the wrestler successful in competition. The wrestling camp includes the presentation of guidelines for proper conditioning, weight training, nutrition, and sport-related exercise. Our camp maintains a balance between mat work, instruction, and fun! The camp takes place in the WLHS wrestling room. (Multi-Purpose Gym)

**Cost** The camp fee is \$50. This includes instruction and a camp t-shirt.

**Equipment** Each wrestler should come dressed to wrestle, but should wear street shoes and change into wrestling shoes. (If you come in wrestling shoes, expect to clean them before you go onto the mats.) Wrestling or gym shoes, athletic supporter, gym shorts or wrestling singlet, and a close-fitting t-shirt are appropriate wrestling dress. Head gear is not required. For safety, loose sweat clothes are NOT allowed on the mat.

**Staff** Head WLHS varsity coach Darrell Roecker is the camp director. He will be assisted by current WLHS staff and athletes.

**Purpose and Facilities** Robotics competition teams must design and build a robot to accomplish a given task. Students that take part in the Introduction to Robotics summer program will learn how to build and program a robot to compete in a game similar to those used in a high school competition. Participants will become familiar with how to mount motors and servos to run a vehicle that can score a goal. If you are interested in robots or have a Lego League team at your school, this program is for you! Students meet at WLHS in room 125 each day.

**Cost** The camp fee is \$75. This includes all materials and a camp t-shirt.

**Staff** Mr. Tim Thierfelder, a mathematics teacher at WLHS, has led the WLHS robotics team for the past six years. Under his leadership, the WLHS team won the 2009 and 2011 Wisconsin State FIRST TECH Challenge Championship and has competed at the FTC World Championships in Atlanta and St. Louis. Mr. Thierfelder teaches Introduction to Engineering and Digital Electronics at WLHS.

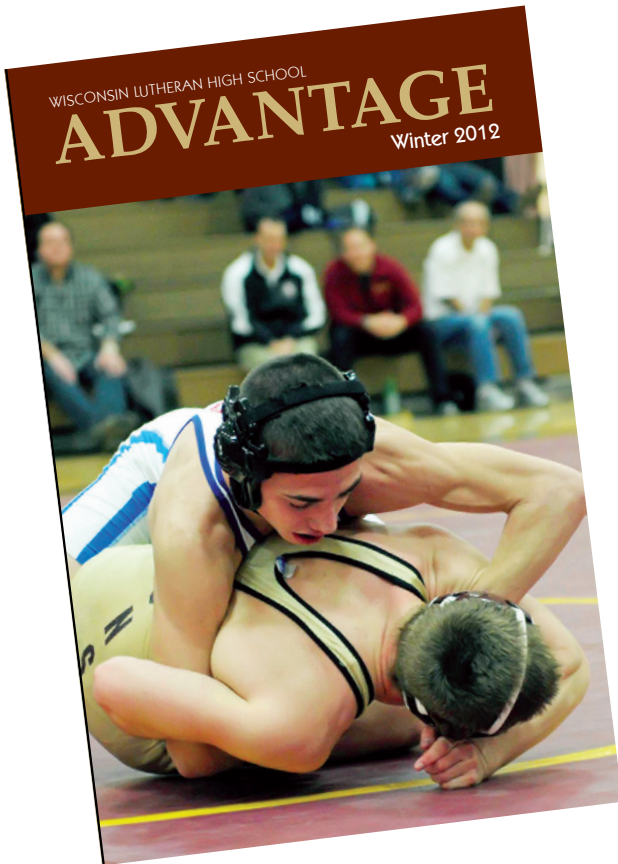
**Cost** The camp fee is \$75. This includes instruction, materials, and a t-shirt.
